AAC FAQs

1) What does the Academic Accommodations Center (AAC) do?

a) AAC provides educational support for eligible Pierce students with disabilities to help them stay on track & achieve their academic goals.

2) Who can qualify for academic accommodations?

- a) Students with disabilities that limit one or more major life activities which cause educational limitations.
- b) Students with a temporary disability may qualify for services if their condition lasts for 45 days or longer.

3) What counts as a disability?

a) Examples of disabilities include, but are not limited to, caring for oneself, performing manual tasks, walking, seeing, hearing, speaking, breathing, learning, working, medical conditions, (such as HIV/AIDS, cancer, diabetes, or asthma), former alcohol or drug addiction, environmental illness, ADD/ADHD, and psychological disorders.

4) What documentation do I need?

- a) An Individualized Educational Plan (IEP)
- b) 504 Plan
- c) Documentation that states the diagnosis, educational limitations, and the signature and license number of a licensed professional
